News on patent, trade mark and design databases on the internet

The international registered design database **DesignView**, at https://www.tmdn.org/tmdsview-web/welcome#, now includes marks from **Bosnia-Herzegovina** and the **Philippines**.

Bulgaria and Monaco are the latest countries to have national phase status information for EP patents available on the European Patent Register through Register Plus, at https://register.epo.org/regviewer, with deep links to the Bulgarian status site. The Global Dossier service linking to file wrapper material in non-EPO countries has extended coverage for Canada (now all applications published since 1st August 1995), Japan (all applications filed since 1st July 2003), South Korea (all applications filed since 1st January 1999), and WIPO (all published applications). Global Dossier records for specific applications are now available as RSS feeds for EPO and Chinese applications, with more countries planned.

The international patent database **The Lens**, at https://www.lens.org, now offers a text search for the classification schedules of the IPC, CPC, and US classification. From the result list of classifications, it is possible to either see the schedule within the classification tree, or add it to a search with a single click.

Russia is now publishing search reports in its Official Bulletin, at www1.fips.ru/wps/portal/ofic_pub_en/

#page=bulletin&type=IZPM. The interface of the site is available in English but the search reports are in Russian only as pdf files.

South Korea has abandoned its K2E-PAT machine translation service for Korean documents.

Spain has launched an improved version of its "Consulta de Expedientes" status and file wrapper database at http://www.oepm.es/es/Bases_de_Datos_Expedientes.html. Advanced Search

fields available are mark type, filing date, applicant, priority number, application number and agent for trade marks; case type, priority, application and publication number and date, title, applicant, inventor, and agent for patents; and case type, application number and date, title, priority number, applicant, designer and agent for registered designs. It is possible to export result lists containing the title, application number, publication number and owner as csv, Excel or pdf files.

The international trade mark database **TMView**, at https://www.tmdn.org/tmview/welcome#, now includes marks from **Colombia** and **India**.

WIPO's Patentscope patent database now includes material from **Australia** (including file wrapper material), **Denmark**, **France**, and **Saudi Arabia**. The Global Brand Database trade mark database includes material from **Chile** and **Thailand**.
